REGISTER NOW FOR THE EURO CHALLENGE 2017

You are warmly invited to participate in the Euro Challenge 2017, an exciting competition-based program for 9th and 10th grade students who are passionate about world history, European studies, and economics. The program, developed by the Delegation of the European Union to the United States, aims to increase students' knowledge of the Euro Area and its single currency, the euro, through a unique learning experience that moves students out of the classroom into the real world.

Working in teams of 3-5, students make presentations to a panel of judges about the current state of the economy in the Euro Area. They also select a country and then identify, explain, and recommend a policy or policies to address an economic challenge facing that specific Euro Area country. Students compete in regional preliminary round heats and advancing schools compete in semi-final and final rounds that take place at the Federal Reserve Bank in New York City in April.

The Moody's Foundation generously provides the top five teams with monetary rewards and the top two placing teams earn a free trip to Washington, D.C. where they deliver their presentations to the embassy of the country they researched.

The competition does not require previous knowledge of economics or Europe.
