## COURSE DEVELOPMENT GRANT FOR UI COLLEGE OF EDUCATION FACULTY 2017-18

**DEADLINE: August 4, 2017** 

The University of Illinois European Union Center is pleased to offer a faculty course development grant for the AY 2017-2018. This award is earmarked for University of Illinois College of Education faculty. The grant will be offered on a competitive basis in the amount of up to \$4,360. Funds MUST be used by August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2018. This grant is made possible by the Title VI National Resource Center grant from the U.S. Dept of Education.

The main objective of this grant is to support course development proposals pursuing contemporary EU-oriented topics that meet the highest standards of excellence and contribute significantly to the advancement of EU studies and EUC academic programs at the University of Illinois. We encourage applications that will develop online courses for pre- or in-service teachers to strengthen knowledge and understanding about Europe, the EU, and transatlantic relations, especially in ways that can combine professional and continuing education needs with demands for increased attention to the EU during a period of rapid social transition, migration, and economic flux.

We are very much open to courses on the 500-level that can be directly incorporated into the curriculum of the EUC's Master of Arts in EU Studies (MAEUS). In the past, similar grants have funded course development on EU issues of special relevance and timeliness, including EU enlargement; the transatlantic relationship; comparative educational structures; EU security and foreign policy; law and comparative constitutional development; business, finance, corporate governance, and economics; agro-environmental policies; immigration; minorities; civil society; gender; cultural identity; and others. We are absolutely open to orientation and methodology and will be glad to consult with prospective applicants on how to craft a competitive proposal.

Grant funds may be used for research assistant salary and fringe benefits. Students in approved cost-recovery and self-supporting programs are not eligible for the graduate assistantship—please consult <a href="http://www.grad.illinois.edu/gradhandbook/2/chapter7/tuition-waivers">http://www.grad.illinois.edu/gradhandbook/2/chapter7/tuition-waivers</a> for further information on policies and a complete list of cost-recovery and self-supporting programs.

These grants may <u>not</u> be used for travel or faculty salary.
